SUMMARY OF CROSSREF

Crossref is a not-for-profit organisation that aims to make scholarly work published online more accessible using unique digital object identifiers (DOIs). This allows users of digitally published works to click on DOIs in order to be directed to the publication. DOIs are increasingly being used when referencing resources are used in academic work. This also holds benefits for authors as their publications can be cited more accurately. Authors are also able to track their citations on platforms like Google Scholar and ResearchGate, for example. DOIs also allow researchers to track the impact of their research. Crossref membership by peer-reviewed publications further allows editors to compare the similarity of manuscripts submitted for publication consideration by means of iThenticate. Editors can therefore make informed decisions about the originality of a manuscript and whether plagiarism is evident.

The Society of Radiographers of South Africa's (SORSA) peer-reviewed journal, *The South African Radiographer*, a peer-reviewed journal, has its own unique DOI, which was obtained in 2021. This is a significant milestone as it ensures that the journal maintains its quality and reputation in the academic community.
